WPLC BROCHURE


Help us spread the word about WPLC!

UPCOMING IDC DISCUSSION

OverDrive's Instant Digital Card (IDC) program has been a discussion of the Steering Committee for the past year. The program has been offered to the WPLC for free if we choose to validate on mobile phone number area code only, otherwise if we choose to use a patron's name and mobile phone to validate that they have a recent residential address within the boundaries of WI, it will cost the WPLC \$0.90 each time a patron is submitted for validation.

A fact sheet with more information was sent out to Committee members in November to share with their systems to gain feedback on pursuing this program. The Committee will discuss and make a decision on whether or not to implement this program for the WPLC at their next meeting on February 21, 2019. [The fact sheet can be found here.](#)

DATA MEETING WITH OVERDRIVE

On December 14, project managers spent the day with three OverDrive staff members to discuss long-standing data and reporting concerns. Some outcomes from the meeting included:

- A plan for more frequent weeding/elimination of titles no longer available from the collection.
- A commitment for a new holds ratio calculation that will help Advantage purchasing.
- A commitment to supply data needed for collection that is not available through existing reports (historical average waiting period by system, for example.)
- New roles and involvement for OverDrive staff with WPLC collection development, including assistance for Advantage selection (if desired) and for report generation.
- A commitment to continue to work together toward getting the information needed to evaluate and grow the collection.

TRANSPARENT LANGUAGES UPDATE

Eight systems will go live with Transparent Languages in February 2019: Arrowhead Library System, IFLS Library System, Milwaukee County Federated Library System, Manitowoc-Calumet Library System, Nicolet Library System, Outagamie Waupaca Library System, South Central Library System, and Southwest Wisconsin Library System.

Pricing was held to the amount originally provided, even though not all systems ended up participating.

NEW NEWSPAPER TITLES

The Wisconsin Newspaper Association completed the most recent batch upload of historical newspaper content in October. This batch totaled 100,000 pages from 6 contributors: Amery Area Public Library, Black River Falls Public Library, Kiel Public Library, Mukwonago Community Library, Stanley Area Historical Society and Waupun Public Library.

A private individual in Michigan has made a donation to WPLC to digitize specific titles from Columbia, Dodge and Racine Counties (approx. 20,000 pages).
